System uses the Internet and the resident's TV or touchscreen (shown above)

**Communication** features provide MORE than the ability to send e-mails, pictures, appointment dates and messages to your loved one. The screen can also display weather, latest news headlines and a personal calendar. More importantly, a unique cognitive assessment is achieved through simple games, brain teasers and questions, stimulating the brain.

**Safety** is maintained with various wireless, discreet sensors. Motion is monitored and alerts can be sent to caregivers if unusual activity is detected (i.e. no motion in the bedroom by 9 a.m.) Lights can be turned on automatically in the night if motion is detected from the bed.

**Wellness** is preserved by monitoring blood pressure, weight and glucose, again sending an alert if readings are out of a set range. Care notes can be recorded by a visiting caregiver for access by family members or other authorized caregivers.

Messaging can be used to send updates or alerts based on expected movement in the home from properly placed sensors.



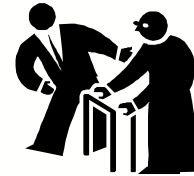
Doors can be opened automatically to allow passage of those with limited mobility
